Discussion	Business (Sam Liss) Updated Legislative Report Sam Liss reported that yesterday was Disability Awareness Day and the Governors Committee scheduled its own events in conjunction with this day. We are currently refining how these events fit with each other such as having the Spirit of the Ada Award ceremony occur in the morning and then move over to the Statehouse. Sam said it is this type of thing that has bi-partisan support. Marlena asked if there was any discussion yesterday about people finding their special skills. Sam said this was discussed during one of the workshops that was held in the morning. Employers realize the attrition rate of those with disabilities are much less than those without. It is important to understand that it is important how well the employer feels a person performed during an interview. Diane will send a listing of this year's winners of the Spirit of the ADA Awards to AOE Committee members. Sam added that Paul Silo and the Public Assets Institute are collaborating on an outreach effort. The project will last three years and then provide outreach as to why people with disabilities should be employed and why they make good employees.		

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Employment of People with Disabilities (GCPD) can advocate internally and to the Governor.

Martha Frank added that it would be great if we could be more informed about the different things that are happening, so we could be more effective providing testimony, etc., and suggests adding this to the agenda for May 3, 2018.

Sherrie said as an example is increasing the minimum wage to \$15/hour which could have a huge impact on our consumers. If we could be more informed about pending legislation such as this, we could become better advocates for those individuals with disabilities.

An example that Martha provided is a bill pending that proposes to add questions around trauma to the Youth Risk Survey and if she wasn't aware of it she wouldn't know to reach out to legislators on this and add her support.

Max added it is important that we communicate to our representatives how devastating it is for those individuals with disabilities when services are cut.

Diane will send out to the group a priority listing of bills that she and Hugh Bradshaw are currently monitoring.

Sam suggested to the group that if people wanted to reach out to their congressional representative related to national pending legislation, there is a proposal pending to eliminate employment restrictions for those of the retirement age community who have disabilities. We have a proposal pending to eliminate employment restrictions Childhood Disabilities Beneficiaries who have been in SSI when they reach retirement age. Right now they are the only group that continue with employment restrictions. They are the only group that still have employment restrictions. The other proposal is to eliminate the termination language in the authorization Ticket to Work
